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JOLLY PHONICS – FAQs

1. What is phonics, and why is it important for my child?

Phonics is a method of teaching children how to read by connecting sounds (phonemes) to letters or groups of letters. It helps children decode words easily and builds a strong foundation for reading and writing.

2. What is phonics and how is it different from Jolly Phonics?

Phonics is a broad method of teaching reading and writing by focusing on the relationship between letters and sounds, while Jolly Phonics uses a multi-sensory approach with actions, songs, and stories to teach letter sounds, blending, and segmenting, making it a popular choice for early childhood education.

3. At what age should my child start phonics classes?

Children can start phonics as early as 4 to 5 years old, usually once they begin recognizing letters and showing interest in reading.

4. My child already has phonics at school. Can he still join your special phonics class?

Absolutely! Even if your child is learning phonics at school, the Jolly Phonics class offers deeper reinforcement through fun, structured methods that build confidence in reading, writing, and spelling. It complements school learning and strengthens your child's language foundation.
